

Organ Methods

The Church Organist - A New Method (Christopher Tambling)

Here is a method that will train organists properly for the traditional role of accompanying hymns and providing suitable service music. It is a comprehensive approach that introduces the techniques of organ playing step-by-step. Aimed at pianists of grade 5 standard plus, The Church Organist begins by introducing the organ - its console, manuals and stops before exploring the pedals, good manuals and pedals technique, coordinating hands with feet, proper use of stops, the basics of improvisation and many other skills important to today's church organist.







Play the Organ (David Sanger)

Complete Church Organist (Daniel Moult)

Church organists have to be extremely versatile: they are expected to offer a wide range of musical skills, from playing voluntaries and improvising to accompanying congregational and choral music. As an organist in a parish church you might find yourself accompanying a polyphonic communion motet one minute and a contemporary worship song the next. In response, the RSCM has developed the Church Music Skills programme, designed to help practising church musicians develop the skills and understanding that they need for their role, and to equip those who want to be able to lead music in worship. This second of three volumes for church organists builds on the skills learnt in the first level, and introduces wider use of the pedals. It further enhances the technical skills necessary to play hymns and worship songs, accompany anthems and Anglican chant psalms, and play voluntaries.




